### Summer Term 1 Curriculum Information Page 2025 - 2026



In **English**, we will be writing Haiku poetry and we will learn how to: -

- Understand syllables in words
- Write a haiku using a 5-7-5 structure
- Use descriptive vocabulary to create clear imagery
- Write about nature or a specific moment in time

In **maths**, we will be learning about:

Decimals: -

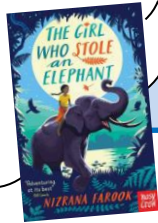
- Tenths as fractions / decimals / on a number line / on a place value chart
- Hundredths as fractions / decimals / on a number line / on a place value chart
- Diving 1 and 2 digit numbers by 10 and by 100

In **Science**, in addition to finishing our Sound Unit, our next topic is 'Living things and their habitats.'

As scientists, we will:

- recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways
- explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment
- recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things

We will be reading



In **Guided reading** sessions, we will be working on our retrieval and predicting skills. We will look at a variety of different texts to support us in developing these skills.

Reading books will be changed as and when needed.

In **art**, our topic is: Roman art in form of Clay

As artists we will be:

- Learning about artists, architects and designers in history.
- Researching Roman pottery and Roman portraits.
- Researching different techniques and skills
- Improving mastery of art and design sculpting techniques, with a range of materials.
- Developing a wide range of art and design techniques in using pattern, texture and form
- Making a product such as a Roman vase, and analysing the process.

In **history**, our topic is: 'The Romans'

The big question is 'What happened when the Romans came to Britain?'

In **PSCHE**, we will be learning about: Citizenship

We will learn about reducing waste for the environment, community groups and their importance, human rights and their importance, the role of local councillors.

In **RE**, we will be learning about: Why the bible is the bestselling book of all time.

We will explore the history of the bible and its relevance to Christians

In **PE**, we will:

- \*have Forest school on MONDAY AFTERNOONS.
- \*learn about movement, dance and Gym through the 'Levels and Directions' unit on Fridays.

In **computing**, we will gain an understanding of the different parts that make up a computer and recall the different parts that make up a computer.

In **French**, our project is: French food

We will be embedding our learning from last half term.

In **music**, our topic is: Adapting and transposing motifs – The Romans.

As musicians we will:-

- Learn a new song about the Romans
- Identify motifs aurally and play a repeated pattern on a tuned instrument
- Create and perform a motif, notating it with reasonable accuracy.
